

My Macros How to Use


Introduction

This allows you to easily create an AddIn for PowerPoint 2007 onwards that can make five of your own macros available to all of your programmes with a proper RIBBON menu.

Use

Open the supplied pptm file “MyMacros”

Press ALT F11 to open the VB editor. If you do not see the “Project Explorer” listing the modules press CTRL R to show it.



Make sure YourCodeModule is selected. DO NOT CHANGE THE 'bas_leaveAlone' Module at all.

Add your own code between the lines Sub Macro1() and End Sub. **DO NOT** change the name 'Macro1'. Remove the line MsgBox ("Macro 1")

It might look like this (with your own code of course)

```
Sub Macro1()
ActivePresentation.Slides(1).Shapes(3).Left=100
ActivePresentation.Slides(1).Shapes(3).Top=100
End Sub
```

Do the same for the other 4 macros

Names for the Menu

To have your own macro names appear in the new menu.

Change the value “Useful 1” to “Your Selected Name”

Example

```
Public Const B1_label As String = "Change Position"
```

Do the same for the other “Useful” names!

You are done (nearly)

Save the pptm in case you want to modify later.

Now Save As choosing PowerPoint AddIn (*.ppam) as the type.

To make available to all presentations:

File > Options (2010)

Office Button > PowerPoint options (2007)

Choose AddIns >> Manage PowerPoint AddIns >> Add New and add the AddIn you saved.

You should now see a new tab with your macros.
